Selection Criteria

This rubric is intended to clarify how the Rackham Doctoral Intern Fellowships Program (RDIFP) team reviews and selects students for funding on the student-identified internships track. We do **not** evaluate based on the types and amounts of funding requested by students. Instead, we review based on the following criteria.

What type of support is the student seeking?

- Full fellowship (Fall/Winter) or full stipend (Spring/Summer) for unpaid internships
- Partial stipend (for paid internships offering less than a standard Rackham stipend
- Tuition (Fall/Winter only)
- Relocation

Checklist Criteria

- 1. The student has received RDIFP funding in the past.
